TWO-TIME SUPER BOWL CHAMPION MALCOLM JENKINS AND THE MALCOLM JENKINS FOUNDATION PROVIDES HOLIDAY DINNER BASKETS TO 540 FAMILIES IN FOUR DIFFERENT CITIES

To combat food insecurity this holiday season in Columbus, OH, Newark, NJ, New Orleans, LA and Philadelphia, PA, Malcolm Jenkins and his Foundation teamed up with local social service organizations and volunteers for its 11th annual Holiday Dinner Basket Surprise

December 17, 2021 — This week, 2x Super Bowl Champion, 3x Pro-Bowler and New Orleans Saints Safety Malcolm Jenkins and The Malcolm Jenkins Foundation (TMJF) hosted their 11th annual Holiday Dinner Basket Surprise (HDBS). For the first time ever, TMJF organized its signature community outreach program to impact four different cities on the same day, providing 540 pre-identified families in need with a nutritious and delicious meal with all the trimmings. On Tuesday, dozens of volunteers packaged and filled dinner baskets with nourishing foods and holiday favorites for 135 families in each community of Columbus, OH, Newark, NJ, New Orleans, LA and Philadelphia, PA.

This year TMJF's HDBS packaged and distributed holiday dinner baskets with the generous support from over 70 community partners and 120 volunteers including MALCOLM JENKINS in New Orleans, Philadelphia Eagles' RODNEY MCLEOD in Philadelphia, Seton Hall Men's Basketball team members (MYLES CALE and JARED RHODEN) in Newark, NJ and Ohio State University's Early Head Start program and fellow Buckeye alum, OBIE STILLWELL in Columbus, OH.

"For me, the holidays have always been centered around the dinner table, to talk in fellowship and share a meal. Right now, many are trying to make decisions between their own bills, gifts under the tree or food on the table. We want to take that burden off of people's shoulders and allow them to enjoy that centerpiece of the holidays. I am grateful that so many of our friends, volunteers and partners came together to support and help our Foundation make a difference this holiday season," said TMJF Founder and Chairman, Malcolm Jenkins.

According to Feeding America, <u>it's estimated that one out of every eight people would</u> <u>experience food insecurity in 2021</u> with COVID-19 as a contributing factor. Our country has seen a devastating impact on our youth with families facing hunger and difficult decisions, not knowing when their next meal will come. Since 2011, The Malcolm Jenkins Foundation has conducted its HDBS initiative to alleviate holiday stress for vulnerable families by providing dinner baskets they can enjoy with their loved-ones. This year is no different. TMJF remains dedicated to its mission of effectuating positive change in the lives of youth in underserved communities, addressing social and economic inequities such as food insecurity. Each festive holiday dinner basket included a turkey (11-14lbs), stuffing, cranberry sauce, gravy, 5-lb bag of potatoes, green beans, cornbread mix, collard greens, rice sides, cheddar and broccoli pasta, spaghetti, spaghetti sauce, condensed milk, chicken broth, dinner rolls or bread, assortment of fruit, a baked pie, juice, a turkey roasting pan, utensils and plates.

"We are thankful to have hosted another successful Holiday Dinner Basket Surprise for the 11th year, and have the support of donors to execute the initiative in all four states where our Foundation is active. Every family deserves to enjoy this special time of year without the stresses of hunger and food insecurity.
